FCC Sets Fiscal Year 2025 Regulatory Fee Payment Amounts

On August 29, 2005, the FCC released a Report and Order establishing its Fiscal Year 2025 regulatory fees. All licensees must pay their required annual regulatory fees by September 25, 2025. Payments received after the deadline will be assessed a 25% late payment penalty.

All licensees must use the FCC CORES System, and review, create, update, or change the fees owed. Then, each licensee must choose a payment method – online payment with a credit or debit card, online payment from a bank account, or sending a wire transfer. Keep in mind, you will not receive an invoice for your Cable/IPTV regulatory fees. Rather, you must proactively file them on Form 159.

Fee amounts. The FCC has set the following regulatory fees:

- 2025 Cable/IPTV/DBS regulatory fee: All MVPDs, including cable systems, IPTV systems and DBS operators that had subscribers as of December 31, 2024, must pay \$1.47 per subscriber, a \$0.20 increase from 2024.
- CARS licenses and permits: CARS facilities operating on October 1, 2025, must pay \$1,945, a \$120 increase from 2024, even if the facility's license expired after October 1, 2024.
- Interconnected VoIP regulatory fee: \$0.005125 for each dollar of interstate and international telecommunications revenue that a provider reports on its Form 499-A.

De minimis exemption. Entities whose total regulatory fee liability, including all categories of fees for which payment is due, is \$1,000 or less are exempt from payment. Municipal providers and providers that qualify as non-profit entities are also exempt from regulatory fees.
